#### Call to order/Pledge

#### Reports from Boards and Committees

#### Historic Downtown Main Street

Amy Hoffman, Director of Historic Downtown Main Street presented a report to Council and Mayor Marksberry of monthly activities. See Attached Exhibit A. Hoffman reported they have 14 Façade applications which they are now starting to rank. Also Amy reported there will be golf carts on display in front of Heritage Hall on Friday night during First Friday festivities.

#### Police Department

Police Chief, David Hewitt presented the March 2009 Police Activity report to Council and Mayor Marksberry. See Attached Exhibit B. He informed all there has been vandalism at the Park and the person has been identified. He stated the movable cameras feed to the lap top which makes it very convenient. Hewitt also state there are investigations going on in Rising Sun which should wrap up in the next few weeks. Hewitt and Marksberry met with Aaron Negangard, Judge Humphrey, and Kim Schmaltz regarding setting up a meeting with the special crimes unit. Marksberry stated they may request a Council member be a part of this meeting.

#### **Project Manager**

Northcutt informed Council and Mayor Marksberry on the following items/issues:

- Fairgrounds Waterline —Northcutt informed Council the original cost for the new waterline at the New Fairgrounds Park was \$9,524. After working with Utility Superintendent, Marty Dennis and Scott Henry, Water Superintendent they have managed to reduce the cost of the waterline to \$5,218. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Slack to approve the cost of the

waterline in the amount of \$5,218, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried 5-

INDOT-Northcutt reported he and Street Commissioner Paul Bovard met with Jim Stark from INDOT to discuss road conditions. Stark informed them INDOT would be addressing the issues. Mayor Marksberry stated SR 262 should have had an overlay to the intersection. Mike stated INDOT has been in town taking

Councilman Radcliff questioned Mike regarding lights over the riverbank. Mike stated they are turned off for the season but he will check them. Councilman Powell questioned where we were with the permits for the next phase of the riverfront. Mike stated we haven't heard anything yet.

### Park Board—Jamie Bell

Clerk Gipson informed Council and Mayor Marksberry Park Director, Jamie Bell had a sick child and her husband was out of town so she could not be in attendance. She submitted a monthly report to Council and Mayor Marksberry, which is in Council's packet of information. See attached Exhibit C.
