## Call to Order/Pledge

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 P.M. by Mayor Bill Marsksberry with all members present. There were no minutes to address at this special meeting.

### **Reports from Committees or Boards**

#### Historic Downtown

Tammy Elbright distributed budget information received from Bruce Goetzman on the renovation of the Presbyterian church for the Mayor and Council to review. See attached Exhibit A.

### **New Business**

Mayor Marksberry informed Council lap tops had been ordered for each of them. These lap tops will allow the City to operate more efficiently with less paper and duplication of documents. It was determined that Nick Antonopolus with Midwest Data Inc. will be available to give general instructions on the lap tops at 6:00 pm Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> prior to the regular scheduled Council meeting. The lap tops will actually be networked through hot spots at City Hall which will enable Council access to the city electronic files during Council meetings.

### Additional Appropriation Resolution 2006-3

Clerk Gipson presented Resolution 2006-3 and an attached breakdown to Council for review. This Resolution had been distributed to Council prior to this meeting. There was some discussion regarding amounts requested from various groups through out the year. There was some discussion regarding the appropriation line for the Presbyterian Church. There were also questions regarding the Port Authority appropriation line for the Ferry and the current status of this project. According to Ed Sullivan who was in attendance; the next step is to go to the Boone County Plan Commission to request property be re-zoned. This step could take 9-12 months. Councilwoman Scott questioned what would happen if the County does not participate in funding this project. Sullivan said the group would be \$200,000 short. Lane Siekman, Attorney for the Port Authority stated no funding from the County could

stop the project—Sullivan stated he hoped the funds could be raised. Clerk Gipson stated Council can move funds around or delete things on the attached breakdown throughout the year. After discussion a motion was made to approve Resolution 2006-3 by Councilwoman Scott, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Slack—motion carried 5-0.

Clerk Gipson informed the Group a 2006 funding request submitted from the River Days Planning Committee was included in their meeting packets. According to Gipson representatives of this committee will be in attendance at the February Council meeting to make this request and answer any questions on the 2006 event.

#### Miscellaneous

Mayor Marksberry offered information regarding current legislative information received from the lobbyist.

Mayor Marksberry requested Council's pleasure regarding a request from the school to sponsor a baseball team. After discussion Council requested Mayor Marksberry get more information or ask Steve Patz to attend the next Council meeting.

### Skateboard Park

Mayor Marksberry distributed information to Council regarding a possible Skateboard park to be located next to the Police Department. This will be discussed at the Feb  $2^{nd}$  meeting.

With nothing further before the Board a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Padgett;  $2^{nd}$  by Councilwoman Scott; meeting adjourned at 6:00 pm.

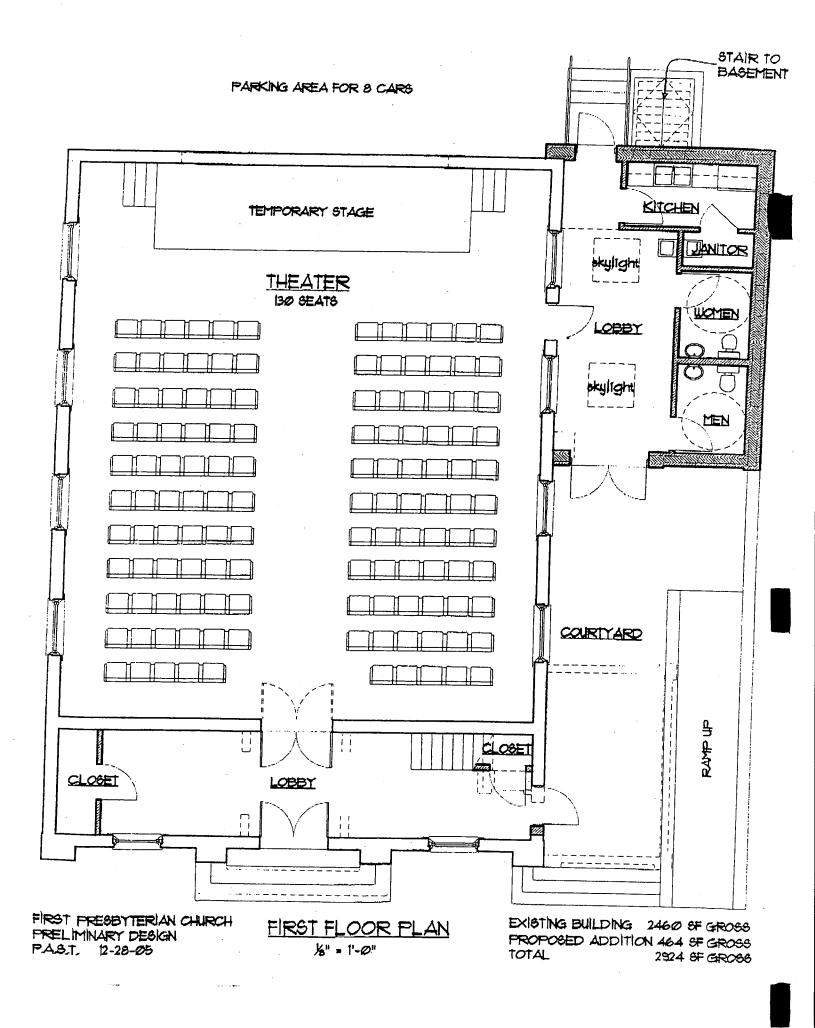
